
Why are HR leaders so important in helping organizations prepare for the future?

The HR leaders are important because they are the key link between the management and the employee workforce. If the connection gets lost, the future of the company becomes uncertain. Our role as human resource professionals is to plan and create different initiatives and events, implement best practices, introduce and refine procedures which keep

this connection alive and the colleagues productive.

HR departments are becoming increasingly important in maintaining a healthy company culture. In what ways should HR change to meet new demands?

The HR role and the way it functions have changed a lot in the last couple of years. We used to meet people in person and talk to them on a daily basis. Now, most of our employees are working remotely and it is a challenge to achieve the strong bonds we used to have with them before. It is much more difficult to have an objective view of the relationship between managers and employees and take timely actions when necessary. We no longer have opportunities for small talk and non-formal conversations just because we don't meet each

On May 15, we celebrated the first release of Rust, a modern multi-paradigm programming language known for its performance, reliability and productivity. It is used to build high-performance systems and has the simplicity of high-level languages like Go and Python, while preserving the control of low-level languages like C. The release of the new language promised to fix the problems that C and C++ developers had been struggling with for a long time, namely memory errors and parallel programming. Just a week later, we celebrated Java's 27th anniversary. There are millions of developers around the world using Java to create everything from desktop programs to web apps. This makes its mastery a useful skill for everyone who wants to work in the technology field. In recent times every year, a new version of Java is released with new features and improvements.

In June, on the occasion of Swift's anniversary, we also looked at the major improvements in the new release of the programming language. Over the years, it has quickly gained popularity among developers thanks to its modern syntax, speed and safety features. It has become the main language for developing iOS, macOS, watchOS, and tvOS apps. In addition, it also has vast usage in server-side programming, machine learning, and others. In the famous Stack Overflow Developer Survey, Swift was voted "Most Loved Programming Language" in 2015 and took second place in 2016.
